

#### CAPE FEAR ACQUISITION (NAWCA PASS-THRU)

DU assisted NCCLT with the acquisition of 265 acres along the Cape Fear River comprised of mature cypress-gum swamp and forested uplands. The property lies within the Steep Run Swamp Significant Natural Heritage Area ranked of very high ecological significance by the North Carolina Natural Heritage Program. A Wood Stork colony as well as a Swallow-tailed Kite nest (the only one documented in NC) have been documented on this site. NCCLT purchased the property and transferred it in a same day closing to the State of North Carolina to be managed by North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission as public game lands.

#### AMOUNT SPENT TO DATE IN STATE 34,205,129

Acquisition of this property will allow the public the opportunity to interact with wildlife relatively uncommon to the area while also protecting the habitats of the wildlife. This project supports the SAMBI objective of protecting forested wetlands in the South Atlantic region.






#### Welcome to Harkers Island and the 36th Annual Core Sound Decoy Festival!





## KIDS CARVING

Decoy carvers have always regularly taught their craft to the next generation and the Core Sound Decoy Guild continues this heritage, not only with members mentoring individual family and friends, but also by



offering a carving experience to youth the third Saturday of each month (except December). Kids Carving is offered free of charge to school age youth beginning at 10 a.m. and finishing at about noon. Youth carvers complete a carved and painted halfsized decoy to take home at the end of the session. Begun by Curt Salter and Walter "Brother" Gaskill two decades ago, approximately 1,600 new carvers have been given an opportunity to experience decoy carving through this guild program. The guild believes this connects us not only to prior



generations of carvers but also promotes a focus on our local Down-east natural beauty and regional heritage. Our guild has also had three World Champion Youth Carvers in recent years and many returning youth carvers.

Brother Gaskill, Ken Brennan, Doug O'Neal, James Morton, and Steve

Robertson deserve special thanks for their repeated help this year. They seem to have a good time as well. Dr. Stan Rule, who leads this wonderful program, also deserves a HUGE THANK YOU for his continued support and dedication to Kids Carving. Our new carving room now has updated dust collection and safety gear is always provided. Guild members coach youth through the process and create an enjoyable and memorable experience.

## 2024 FEATURED BIRD The Swan

The featured waterfowl for the 2024 Core Sound Decoy Festival is the swan. Actually, there are several different species of these beautiful, graceful birds, but the most common species in Eastern North Carolina waters is the Tundra Swan, nicknamed the Whistling Swan. Like most migratory waterfowl, swans breed in the far north and winter in southern waters. The eastern band primarily winters in the coastal waters from Delaware to North Carolina, and Lake Mattamuskeet. Like geese, swans mate for life.

These elegant birds were declining in numbers but have recovered immensely, and now a low limited number can be harvested by hunters with permits obtained through a lottery. Each bird usually weighs between 12 and 20 pounds. Swans are reputed not to be as savory as geese or many of the duck species.



While resting on water swans usually display a straight neck and their heads are horizontal, except when they are

feeding. Sometimes their head and neck exhibit a graceful "S" curve. When feeding, they mostly dip their long necks down to the bottom for vegetative matter. During flight, their wings are high over their backs and their long, white necks are straight ahead. They pitch into the water gracefully and swim with ease and grace, but are awkward when walking on land. When they take flight, they must face the wind and putter 15-20 feet. Once airborne, their legs and feet extend out behind their bodies. On long flights, like geese, they fly in a "V" formation. For short distances, they may fly in a wavy line or no formation at all. According to ornithologists, swans fly a bit faster than geese--roughly 50 miles per hour. Throughout Hyde County and along the Northern Outer Banks, there is no other such captivating sight as seeing swans in flight.

This year's featured carver is the talented Kelley Nelson. His talent needs no introduction if you have had the privilege of attending previous festivals; Kelley's wonderful carvings are always on display as soon as you enter the gym.


Kelley, a Carteret County Native, worked in carpentry and boat building for ten or twelve years as well as professional diving. He got his start decoy carving in 1999 after attending a carving class taught by Curtis Watkins at Carteret Community College. From there Kelley was hooked and his carving career took off. He continued taking classes at the community college and, when the time came, he took over as instructor where he taught for fourteen years. Since that time he has mentored many, and is a familiar face at the regular Guild meetings giving his continued support to the Guild and Decoy Festival.

Since the first pair of buffleheads that he carved Kelley has carved thousands of ducks, shorebirds, miniature decoys, and even fish. "I came in third place at the Wards World Championship with a three foot Blacktip Shark, the first year I entered"Kelley recalled. He has entered many competitions since then and has entered his birds in the IWCA Working, Root head, Decoy Painting Competition here at the Core Sound Decoy Festival. I asked Kelley what his favorite bird was to carve, to which he replied "no preference", stating that he thoroughly enjoyed carving Redheads, Canvasbacks, and Pintails.

Kelley likes to use a variety of carving styles to keep things interesting. He routinely carves with cork, canvas, tupelo, and juniper; carving full sized birds, contemporary antiques, and miniatures. Whatever your

preference in decoys Kelley will likely have a piece that will catch your eye so stop by his booth to see Kelley and his wife Erin.

Kelley, thank you for supporting the Festival through the years, congratulations on being selected as featured carver!




























# 2024 POSTER CONTEST



Community and group hunts occurred till the late 1950s—although outlawed long before. Although loons do not "decoy", loon decoys were included in regional hunting rigs as "confidence" decoys.



## CORE SOUND DECOY FESTIVAL COMPETITION

Welcome to the 36th Annual Core Sound Decoy Festival. We hope that you enjoy your visit to the festival and that your experience is a great one. Take time to visit the classrooms and gym to see some beautiful hand crafted decoys, and make sure you swing by the cafeteria where you are sure to experience the delicious aroma of some of the tasty food prepared by the Harkers Island Elementary school staff. Chances are you won't be able to resist the homemade clam chowder or shrimp burgers. Once you have entered the cafeteria you have also made your way into the decoy competition area, so please take a few minutes to watch the competition. Many of the birds will be required to self -right in our unique float tank, which is designed as a layout boat.





Over the two day festival the competition

will involve over 200 hand-carved and painted entries in various categories from approximately 70-80 different carvers. Many styles of decoys will be entered into competition during our festival, including the detailed and extremely beautiful decorative decoys and birds, contemporary antique decoys, shorebirds, canvas decoys, miniatures, and the NC Traditional Championship, sponsored by the Kent Hood

Foundation. This year, we are honored to be hosting the 2024 International Waterfowl Carvers Association (IWCA) Working Championship and Young Guns Championship.

While the competition is underway, we ask that you observe the DO NOT ENTER signs so that the judges and other volunteers can complete the judging in a timely fashion. Once the judging is complete, we will remove the signs and allow you the opportunity to view the birds up close. We also ask that you do not handle the decoys as accidents do happen and we want to protect the decoys as the carvers have invested quite a bit of time (and sweat) in creating these pieces of artwork.

On Sunday, you will have the opportunity to watch decoy carving live as several carvers will have one hour to carve the head of a duck decoy. Not only is this an enjoyable opportunity to watch the carvers , but you also get the chance to listen to the carvers heckle and rib each other as they whittle away!!

Once again, 'thank you' for attending our festival and we sincerely hope that you will come by and watch the competition.








## FESTIVAL EVENTS

complete their head carving. First, Second, Third, and Honorable Mention ribbons will be awarded, and the

First Place winner will also receive a plaque. THANK YOU to Joe Fulcher for all of his hard work with the head whittling contest! Sunday is Youth Day at the Decoy Festival, and youth are welcomed with free entry, door prizes, and many other activities throughout the day! A big draw is the Youth Decoy Competition ...2008 was our first Youth Decoy Competition in which youth 17 and under were able to compete and be recognized and the youth competition has many different divisions for all ages and all skill levels!






